The Season of Gratitude

'T'is the season for gratitude and here at Todd Creek Village Metropolitan District, we could not be more thankful for our outstanding team of Colorado Water Professionals. Becoming a Colorado Water Professional (CWP), maintaining certifications, and advancing to the next certification level requires dedication, hard work, and a commitment to the water industry.

Every one of our TCVM field employee is a certified CWP. Our team is dedicated to life-long learning both within their scope of work and broader water topics. To become a CWP an individual must learn, study, and retain specific water terms, concepts, and math to pass the certification test. To advance to the next



certification level, an additional test with progressively harder concepts and mathematics must be passed. Each year every operator must complete "TU"s (training units) which reinforce important water knowledge and provide the opportunity to gain new water knowledge. The more, or higher-level, certifications an operator has, the more TUs they must complete.

As a small utility, we have a small team. While each operator has an area of primary focus, they also cross-train and acquire certifications within other areas to be ready to "step up to the plate" when another team member needs a helping hand. To achieve, maintain, and advance CWP certifications, an operator must engage in direct experience within the scope of each certification they hold. That means, for example, that our distribution team not only completes their normal distribution duties to maintain their Distribution CWP Certification, but they also rotate into the treatment plant to engage in direct experience to achieve/maintain a Water Treatment CWP Certification. Our operators are not afraid of hard work!

Finally, a CWP must show a commitment to the water industry. The final piece to advancing in CWP certifications is time. An operator not only has to have the correct knowledge and experience, but each certification level can only be achieved after a specific amount of time, often years, within the industry and the applicable industry field. TCVM is proud to have multiple employees with top-level CWP certifications — evidence of their decades-long commitment to the Colorado water industry.
